This is your “pattern” for creating this project. It’s designed to work with any stamps, ink, and paper you may have on hand and is intended to be your starting point for some fun.

This project sheet gives you the measurements for all the layers and general placement - but remember, it’s only a guide. Go ahead and vary your sizes and shapes and add additional layers (or take some away).

TIPS:

- When making the project in this tutorial, you will notice there’s a list of supplies used, cutting measurements, and step-by-step instructions. Create exactly per the tutorial or be creative and make your cards your own.
- Relax and enjoy the process. Crafting is meant to be fun!

Supplies Used:

- Stamp Sets: Peaceful View, Impressions Abloom
- Ink: Night of Navy
- Cardstock: Basic White, Misty Moonlight, Night of Navy
- Tools: 2" Circle Punch, Blending Brush, Bone Folder, Paper Trimmer
- Adhesives: Stampin' Dimensionals, Stampin' Seal or Multipurpose Liquid Glue
- Accessories: Stampin' Up! Masking Paper
- Grid Paper (optional but helpful for transferring image evenly)

Measurements

- Card Base: 8-1/2" x 5-1/2" (Night of Navy), scored at 4-1/4"
- Card Front Panel: 3-3/4" x 5" (Basic White)
- Mat for Card Front: 5-1/8" x 3-7/8" (Misty Moonlight)
- Sentiment Panel (Front): 1-3/4" x 1" (Basic White)
- Mat for Sentiment Panel: 1-7/8" x 1-1/8" (Misty Moonlight)
- Inside Panel: 5" x 3-3/4" (Basic White)
- Mat for Inside Panel: 5-1/8" x 3-7/8" (Misty Moonlight)



Instructions

1. Ink the large silhouette image from the *Peaceful View* stamp set with Night of Navy ink. Be sure the entire surface is evenly inked.
2. Lay the Basic White card front panel face down over the inked stamp. Cover with grid paper and gently rub the back to transfer the image evenly onto the cardstock. Carefully remove the grid paper and flip the cardstock to reveal the stamped scene.
3. Punch a 2" circle out of Stampin' Up! Masking Paper and place it over the stamped image where you'd like to create the "moon" effect—partially covering the bird, fence, and tree.
4. Using a Blending Brush and Night of Navy ink, softly blend over the scene. When the masking paper is removed, it will leave a moonlit glow in the masked area.

5. Stamp “Thanks” from the *Impressions Abloom* stamp set onto the small Basic White sentiment panel. Stamp “So Very Much” onto the Basic White inside panel. Both should be in Night of Navy ink.
6. Mat each stamped piece with the coordinating Misty Moonlight cardstock.
7. Adhere the stamped front panel to the Misty Moonlight mat and attach to the Night of Navy card base.



8. Add the “Thanks” sentiment to the front using Dimensionals for extra depth.
9. Attach the inside sentiment panel to its Misty Moonlight mat and adhere inside the card.

Additional Tips for Success

- When using large background stamps, inking the stamp face up and laying your cardstock on top gives you better control and even pressure.
- Use grid paper or scrap paper to avoid inky fingers when transferring your image—especially helpful when working with full-card designs.
- To avoid harsh blending lines, start blending off the edge of your cardstock or in a circular motion on scrap paper first before moving onto your project.
